3KND were there providing a live to air broadcast around the country to many who were unable to attend in person. This event focused on the stories and songs to bring about a healing experience necessary for the pain and institutionalised trauma that Jan 26th creates each year.

# Tamworth Country Music Festival – Day One and Two

The 3KND team were back in Tamworth for the 51st Country Music Festival 2023 which kicked off on Friday the 13<sup>th</sup> of Jan. With all the best of Australian country music from the buskers on the famous Peel Street to the Golden Guitar Awards which was held at the Tamworth Regional Entertainment and Conference Centre on Saturday the 21<sup>st</sup>. The Tamworth Country Music Festival has a strong history and tradition making it a unique festival that calls people from all over the country and the world to join in the long 10-day festivities with artists performing in different places over Tamworth.

The 3KND team conducted a live broadcast with interviews and talked to some of this year's Golden Guitar nominees including The Wolf Brothers, Kevin Bennett, Hayley Jensen, Kirsty Lee Akers just to name a few and some of the listeners favourites like Troy Cassar Daley.

The Tamworth Country Music Festival was started in 1973 when local country music radio station 2TM created the Country Music Awards and planned the festival to draw recognition to the awards. The festival has often been recognised as one of the ten best music festivals in the world.

# Caleb Thaiday – The Body Is More Than This



The Body is More Than This (26 Jan – 12 Feb), curated by Kin Francis, presents visual narratives from six artists who identify as gender diverse and nonbinary. Works in this exhibition permeate across many ideas, from reckoning with histories of migration, experimenting with gender expression outside of Western restraints, and defining relationships with lands and family across distances. Caleb Thaiday is Meriam from the Eastern Torres Strait Islands of Mer and Erub and grew up on Yidinji country in Cairns. Caleb is my special guest today after 8.30am.

After completing a Bachelor of Music Technology at Griffith University in Brisbane, they went freelance in FNQ as an audio engineer, sound designer, videographer and composer. Now living on Kulin land since mid-2018, Caleb is a drag performer under the stage name Cerulean. Cerulean is the current reigning Miss First Nation 2021. She is an expressive blue gem who descended from the Pisces constellation to bless mere mortals with a raining cloud of excitement, energy and fun! Her body morphs into an ensemble of contrasting forms, exploring performance through concepts.

# 2023 Knox Citizen Of The Year – Ricky Baldwin

Congratulations to Ricky Baldwin, Knox Citizen of the Year 2023 recipient!

Ricky has been recognised for his commitment and service to the local community. He is the founder of Victoria's first Indigenous basketball academy, [Koorie Academy Basketball](#). The academy engages and empowers young Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people through basketball, sport and cultural activities. He has worked selflessly over years to help Indigenous youth connect to their roots and be proud of their culture and community. Ricky's commitment to the Knox community is multifaceted. He supports the community through donations to people in need. He is a board director with Mullum Mullum Indigenous Gathering Place, ensuring that health and wellbeing is at the front and centre of cultural identity and connection to land and culture for young people. He creates cultural artefacts and objects that he donates to assist with fundraising. Ricky also works with the National Basketball League (NBL) to support the Indigenous round and is working to improve the inclusion of cultural protocols and safety into the NBL.

It is this commitment that resulted in Ricky being awarded the 2019 Australian Indigenous Excellence Commitment to Community Award. He was also shortlisted for the Australian of the Year in 2020 and was inducted into The Knox Raiders Hall of Fame.

One nominator concluded by stating that Ricky is selfless, inspiring and dedicated to giving Indigenous youth every opportunity to be the best version of themselves and to be proud of their culture and community. He provides hope and support to Indigenous youth who might otherwise struggle and uses basketball to help them gain confidence. He bridges the gaps between Indigenous and non-Indigenous communities by holding events that brings them together in a fun learning environment.

## Dan Sultan Yarns With Troy From The Midday Rush

Troy from the Midday Rush had a yarn with the very talented Dan Sultan. This is a powerful interview that is open, raw and honest. Dan opens up about many things and about his upcoming performance at the Share The Spirit Festival on Invasion Day.

Dan Sultan is an Australian singer/songwriter and actor based in Melbourne. His electric roots rock sound has won him fans across the country.

Sultan began playing music at a young age, influenced by [Jimi Hendrix](#) and classic guitar rock, though tribal culture was also a mainstay of his youth and would later find a place in his musical life. Working with guitarist and collaborator Scott Wilson, Sultan released his debut album, *Homemade Biscuits*, in 2006 aided by a grant from musician [John Butler](#)'s Seed Fund. His soulful, country-influenced rock was well-received and his second album, 2009's [Get Out While You Can](#), made it to number one on Australia's independent album chart. He and his band went on to play most of the country's prominent musical festivals. That same year, he made his acting debut in the film adaptation of the musical [Bran Nue Dae](#). Continuing to honour his tribal roots, Sultan was pegged to join the aboriginal music collective [the Black Arm Band](#).

In 2010, he was the recipient of two ARIA (Australian Recording Industry Awards) awards for Best Blues and Roots Album and Best Male Artist. For his third long-player, he and his band travelled to the U.S. to record with producer [Jacquire King](#) (*Kings of Leon*, *Tom Waits*, *Modest Mouse*) in Nashville. The album *Blackbird* was released in the summer of 2014, reaching number four on the Australian charts and eventually going gold. For his fourth LP, 2017's *Killer*, Sultan moved in more of a hard-hitting pop and neo-soul direction with production from [Jan Skubiszewski](#).

## Indigenous Excellence – Harry Williams



Did you know that Wiradjuri man Harry Williams was the first Aboriginal soccer star to play for Australia at the FIFA World Cup in 1974? 1974 was the first year the Australian Team qualified for the World Cup. Born in Sydney in 1951, he began his sporting life at the age of 9 with the St George Police Boys Club. He rose through the ranks of St George Budapest, and in 1970 was picked for the national team, after playing 6 first grade games. Williams played 43 games for Australia between 1970 and 1977.

## Taungurung Land Hand Back

The Taungurung Land and Waters Council (TLaWC) is excited to announce the formal transfer of the Nyagaroon property from the Victorian Government to the Taungurung people.

Nyagaroon – the Taungurung name for the location – is part of the former Mohican Run and most recently operated as the Acheron Youth Camp. The location sits on more than 100 hectares of Taungurung Country.

A powerful video presentation of the response from the Taungurung people is available below.

TLaWC CEO Matt Burns is delighted that the Taungurung people will now have the land rightfully returned, following all the work by the community to reclaim a place that saw the harsh impacts of colonisation.

‘The Taungurung Community has been advocating for the Nyagaroon land transfer for many years, because this place holds a deep and sad history for the Taungurung people.’

‘This is now an opportunity to create a welcoming, positive space for Taungurung people and future generations, connecting with the Country of our Ancestors.’

A group of TLaWC Board members and staff visited the property in the TLaWC bus to assess the grounds, yarn about the significance of the transfer, and discuss the future for the site.

An event will be held in 2023 to commemorate this important moment in Taungurung history.

Special thanks to the Department of Justice and Community Safety (DJCS) for their tenacity and commitment to ensure land justice was achieved for the Taungurung people.





# Spirit of Tasmania Geelong Terminal Artwork



One of Geelong's largest murals spanning approximately 80 metres has been installed at the [Spirit of Tasmania](#) Quay passenger terminal. A collaborative effort by [Wadawurrung Traditional Owners Aboriginal Corporation](#) (represented by WTOAC) artist John Challis, [Geelong Port](#), and Spirit of Tasmania, the magnificent artwork installation features the Orange-bellied parrot as it travels across the mural and is symbolic of the feathered friend migrating across Sea Country to meet Lutruwita (Tasmania) Country of the Palawa/Tasmanian Aboriginal people for the summer, and then to Wadawurrung Country for the winter. There are also numerous panels of interpretive artwork that feature Djilang and Coriayo Bay, as well as an Acknowledgement to Country, in both Wadawurrung and English Languages. As passengers arrive at the terminal building and drop-off roundabout, they can view three carved basalt stone shells - there is Wallaby grass carved from reclaimed timber pier pylons, and a stainless steel Kawirr (Emu) feather. These external artworks are a collaboration between WTOAC and Geelong Port and created and constructed by Romanis Trinham Collaborations PL (Glenn Romanis and Mark Trinham) and Geelong mosaic artist Dr Helen Bodycomb.
